The Washington Health Benefit Exchange is urging 2014 Qualified Health Plan customers who have not yet renewed their coverage for 2015 to return as soon as possible to continue their health plan this year. The open enrollment period ends on Feb. 15, 2015. An enrollment event is taking place on Friday, February 13th at Fort Vancouver Regional Library from 11 am to 2 pm. Enrollment in Washington Apple Health (Medicaid) is year-round. Residents interested in signing up for health coverage may visit <a href="www.wahealthplanfinder.org">www.wahealthplanfinder.org</a>. If you are unsure of your current enrollment status, you can call the Customer Support Center at 1-855-923-4633.

You can also request an appointment with a certified enrollment assister to complete your application. The day's agenda includes: Multi-faith reflections on advocating for justice; caucus meetings by legislative district; workshops on FAN's five policy areas (see our <a href="legislative agenda">legislative agenda</a>); presentations by a Senator in the morning, with other electeds and the Governor's budget director joining us in the afternoon.

Appointments with your elected officials will be scheduled for you if you register by February 12. Lunch is provided. Cost is \$15 in advance, \$20 at the door.

# IT'S TIME FOR A NEW PICTORIAL CHURCH DIRECTORY!

We are making appointments now for photos for our new church directory and hope everyone will be able to fit into the time schedule. The appointment dates are Thursday, February 19<sup>th</sup> from 1:00 pm to 8:30 pm, Friday, February 20<sup>th</sup> from 1:00 pm to 8:30 pm and Saturday, February 21<sup>st</sup> from 10:00 am to 5:30 pm. Each family will receive a complimentary professional 8 x 10 portrait and a copy of the new church directory.

After you are photographed, you will be able to view your images immediately and choose one for the directory. There will be an opportunity to purchase additional portraits if you wish, but there is no obligation to do so. Extended family members or friends are welcome to have a portrait taken even though they will not be in the directory. Also, you may include pets or props to make your photos more meaningful.

Our church will receive extra directories for our own use if people outside the church come for portraits, even if they don't make a purchase. They will also receive a free 8 x 10.

If you are unable to have your portrait taken, you may submit a photo of your own (in a vertical shape). Professionally taken photos cannot be used because of copyright laws, so we will need a photo taken with a digital camera that we can transmit to LifeTouch, the company that is doing our directory.

If you have a family member age 60 or older, all members of your group will receive a 20% discount on photo orders.
