An Outpouring of Love: From North Carolina to Washington

Dear Church Family,

If social justice is what an outpouring of love looks like in public, then our nation witnessed a stunning manifestation of love on Valentine's Day when tens of thousands marched in downtown Raleigh, North Carolina. The demonstration was yet another accomplishment of the Moral Monday movement. This movement has now conducted nine annual marches with last year's march drawing more than 80,000 participants in what was described as "the largest civil rights rally in the South since the Selma to Montgomery march in 1965."

The Moral Monday movement is a fusion of groups and individuals devoted to working on issues of immigration, LGBT rights, race, labor, and the environment. Its primary public leader has been the Rev. Dr. William Barber II, a Disciples of Christ pastor and the president of North Carolina NAACP. In describing the diversity of the movement, Barber declares:

We like to say we're black, we're brown, we're white, we're young, we're old, we're gay, we're straight, we're teachers, we're students, we're doctors, we're the uninsured, we're the underemployed, we're labor rights, we're businesspeople, we're Republicans, we're Democrats, we're independents, we are North Carolina.

For me, an inspiring vision is to imagine a similarly diverse movement taking root in our own state. We are despairingly weak when we splinter in countless directions, yet we are astoundingly strong when we join together in a common cause. As Barber notes, we are confronting issues today that are not about the left or the right side of a matter. They are about "the moral center of who we claim to be as a people."

On Valentine's Day, Barber diagnosed the problem of our country as a "heart problem" in need of a defibrillator. Maybe we can be part of getting the defibrillator working in our own state. As people of faith, we can deliver a therapeutic dose of spiritual energy to our deteriorating social body. With our own outpouring of love, we can be just what the doctor ordered.

Memorial Contributions Benefit Church

A few years ago we published an article in the Link telling the congregation about the many items that were given to the church in memory of someone usually purchased with donated Memorial funds. We are going to repeat portions of that article and give an update on more recent contributions. As you come into our beautiful worship center you will notice many meaningful objects that help us center our thoughts and be ready to experience the spiritual aspect of being in a holy place. These include items as large as the wood carvings, banners, marble slab on the Altar, or the concert grand piano in the sanctuary or items as small as individual hymnals and pieces of music for the choir. As you go around the church you will also find many items less spiritual, but necessary to maintain the facility and our programs such as kindergarten furniture, bulletin boards, office equipment, and storage shed for the grounds equipment. What these, and many other items, have in common is that they are outside or beyond the normal church budget. They come to us from monies donated as memorials to past members and friends.

Most recently, we have a new organ purchased with memorial funds and contributions, new banners, trees and lavender plants, choir renovation, flooring for Plymouth Room and lower level, furniture, and hospitality cabinet in Bradford Hall.
