

The Definition of Church: The Pastor's Annual Report

In reflecting upon this past year, I find myself focused on the meaning of two words. The first word that strikes me is "prophet." For much of 2014 and part of 2015, our theme was "The Year of the Prophets." On the first Sunday of each month, we would learn about a different biblical prophet. In the process, we learned about our Hebraic roots. We learned about the Jewish heritage that was fundamental in shaping Jesus and the early church. The etymological root of the word "prophet" by itself is interesting. It is thought to have originally meant "one who is called."

The other word that stands out for me is *ekklesia*, the Greek word often translated as church. It literally means "the called out ones." In other words, a church can be regarded as an assembly of prophets. We are a group of persons who intentionally gather to discern God's will in our lives. The results can be transformative—not only for ourselves, but also for the broader world. Our divine calling inevitably orients us outward. God breaks down the walls of self-interest and absorption as our sense of passion and purpose becomes bound to the needs and sufferings of others.

Recently, I have thought a lot about what it means to be a church and why church is so important. If you have not already done so, I encourage you to read an article on our website called "Ten Reasons to Go to Church." It was written by the Rev. Anne Russ who kindly gives permission for others to freely share what she wrote. As Christians, we are not always good at talking about church and why others might want to join us. This article is terrific at helping us to find the right words. One part I will highlight is the # 2 reason to go to church:

Taking a break from our hectic lives to come to church is accepting the gift of Sabbath. Wayne Mueller says "(Sabbath) dissolves the artificial urgency of our days, because it liberates us from the need to be finished." We don't take Sabbath and come to worship because we have time and have finished up everything that needs to be done. We take Sabbath because it is time to stop, and we are designed to stop, rest and reflect. Those who don't are destined to crash and burn.

As we take stock of this past year in the life of our church, I invite all of you to pause for a moment. Reflect upon the many accomplishments detailed in our annual report. Reflect upon the incredible talent, wisdom, and generosity of our members. Reflect as well upon the ministries of our gifted staff: Virginia Dunbar, Angie Hill, Kristina Martin, Christopher Schindler, Richard Trefren, and Kathy Woolley.

In the year ahead, let us continue to be the ones who are called out. Let us continue to be prophets in whatever small and large ways we can. If we do this, we cannot fail to make a difference in our world.

Triple Point is a local youth group for gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, questioning, and straight ally youth, ages 13-21 years old. They provide a safe space, support, education, information and referral services through Children's Home Society of Washington (CHSW.) Triple Point also provides youth with a meal and structured activities during each meeting. The Vancouver chapter currently meets at the CHSW building at 1112 Columbia St, downtown Vancouver, but they are in the process of planning and fundraising for their own building.

Triple Point meets every Tuesday from 3:00 – 6:00pm for Drop-In and the Support Group meets in the evening from 6 p.m.-8 p.m. Volunteers provide a meal for the kids and mentoring.
