A Bundle of Love

Dear Church Family,

Recently, I began reading to Danalyn the book version of Walt Disney's *Lady and the Tramp*. Near the beginning of the story a cocker spaniel named Lady finds she is no longer the focus of love and affection among the humans who once doted over her. That focus now belongs to a newborn human baby. When Lady then encounters a stray mutt named Tramp, he derogatorily refers to the baby as "a bundle of trouble." In reading this aloud, I immediately became fearful of the negative influence Tramp's words could have on Danalyn. Only a day earlier, we had welcomed a newborn baby into our own house. I didn't want Danalyn thinking of her new baby sister as "a bundle of trouble." Upon reading Tramp's remark, the best verbal remedy I could immediately muster was the trite declaration, "That's not a nice thing to say!" After thinking about it some more, I explained to Danalyn that the baby was actually "a bundle of love."

Fortunately, Danalyn did not take Tramp's sentiment to heart. Instead, she found his words to be laughably ridiculous and an ongoing source of humor for that day and days to come. "A baby isn't a bundle of trouble," she would say shaking her head as if it was the most outlandishly silly comment ever. Unfortunately, the real world contrast of thinking of a child as "a bundle of love" rather than "a bundle of trouble" is no laughing matter when it comes to adults. Childcare guru Janet Lansbury indicates as much in her aptly titled book *No Bad Kids: Toddler Discipline without Shame*. Sadly, parents all too often treat their kids as bundles of trouble when they take child misbehavior personally, when they respond with lectures, scoldings, and punishments, when they do everything from spanking to the quiet withdrawal of love.

My interaction with Danalyn inspired me to think about what I should be doing to nurture our newborn Kylie as a bundle of love. At this moment, I think the best I can do as a parent is to perform simple acts of love myself. For me, this includes something as mundane and smelly as changing a diaper. If God is love, then this means God can indeed be present in the most unlikely and unseemly places. I find this to be remarkably inspiring news. Our daily lives are so much more meaningful and profound when we realize they are filled with a divine love that can rise above the ordinary mess and stink of existence. May we each delight in the startling bundles gifted to us by the God of abundant grace.




Mission & Outreach June Special Offering

Friends of the Carpenter" is a faith-based Day Shelter that provides safety and a sense of purpose to members of our community. It began in 1998 as a vision of simple welcome and personal interaction between volunteers from the church and those in the community who are disadvantaged. Wood devotional items are made at the shelter, but the main product is relationships--helping the disadvantaged see themselves as people of worth.

The Friendship Center is located at 1600 W 20th Street in Vancouver. It is open from 9 am to 4 pm, Monday through Friday. Volunteers are always needed to provide welcome and to help with activities, staff the reception desk, lead devotions or singing, and more. The 2nd Chance Thrift Store, located at 3414 A NE 52nd Street (52nd & St. Johns Blvd.) in Vancouver needs volunteer workers, donations, and shoppers.

The ministry is growing. The number of hours clients spent at the Friendship Center increased 60% during the first quarter of 2015 compared to the first quarters of 2012-2014.
