Turn! Turn! Turn!: A Groovy 60s Sunday

Dear Church Family,

For our Groovy 60s Worship Service this upcoming Sunday, Doug and Judy Smith will perform a song made famous by the Byrds. In 1965, the Byrds reached the top of the charts with their folk rock rendition of "Turn! Turn! Turn!" While the melody was originally composed by Pete Seeger, the lyrics have the distinction of being the oldest of any #1 hit. The lyrics come from the Book of Ecclesiastes. In church, we often read the simple, yet beautiful poetry of this scripture at memorial services. Its words capture the seasons and cycles of life. They remind of us of how there is "a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance."

Along with the refrain, "Turn! Turn!," Seeger did make one slight addition to the lyrics. This addition may well explain why the song became such a hit at a time when the Vietnam War was escalating. Seeger added six words to the final verse from Ecclesiastes: "a time for love, and a time for hate; a time for war, and a time for peace, I swear it's not too late."

This Sunday I will be preaching on Ecclesiastes. I invite you to think about whether this scripture could at times be the soundtrack for your own life. What seasons have you been through? What season are you in right now?

For all of life's ups, downs, and constant turns, may you feel God's presence.

- a time to keep silence, and a time to speak;


