What Do We Do Now?

The calendar shows that we are now in the month of August. Many of you are wondering, "when are we going to decide on a new minister, how is the selection process being decided,"......these questions and more have probably been discussed in the pews, narthex, committee and ministry meetings and the parking lot since Brooks announced his resignation and his move to Cleveland.

As moderator, many thoughts ran through my head when I read Brooks email to me announcing his intention.

Now that this news has settled in, it is time for action. The church council's executive committee: Moderator, Vice Moderator, Treasurer, Financial Secretary and Clerk met with Walter John Boris, Central Pacific Conference Minister to go over the process and procedures for calling a minister. During this meeting the options offered by Walter John were: select an interim minister or immediately start a search for a Settled Minister. The committee voted to look for an Interim Minister first. We provided the full council with our reason for taking this step and they approved.

Walter John then provided us with four potential interim minister candidates' profiles in late July. We met on July 20th to see the profiles for the first time, but devoted most of the meeting to discussing the selection process, planning to meet-with the full council, and deciding that we would plan to contact our top two candidates. We met again on August 6 to delve deeper into each candidate's background and to begin preparing the questions we want to ask the candidates during an interview. From this meeting we agreed on two candidates and contacted both to determine their interest. Both expressed interest in interviewing for the position.

We will interview both candidates on August 19th. Following that meeting we will determine if we are prepared to offer one of them the position of Interim Minister.

The goal of the committee is to have our Interim Minister in place by October 1st.

Both candidates are currently employed, so in fairness to them we are not prepared to announce their names at this time.

We hope to have more news to share very soon!

New Class this Fall

Do you know everything there is to know about the Bible? This fall, a new class comes to First Congregational UCC. It has also been called *Bible 101: Everything You Wanted to Know about the Bible and Were Afraid to Ask.*

This class is composed of three sections: **Section I: How can we read the Bible most effectively?** We will discuss eight approaches to Bible Reading using eight books of the Bible as examples. Students will be guided to set aside a time each day to read from the Bible and/or devotional book. **Section II: How Did We Get the Bible?** Who wrote it and how do we know it? Why did these books get into the Bible and what happened to books that didn't make the cut? Who decided and when? Why do we include the Old Testament in a Christian Bible?

Section III: What's in the Bible? We will review types of Biblical literature with interesting examples of each. We will explore Biblical divisions and books to examine how each can be meaningful to us.

The class should give each person a comfortability with the Bible and some new understandings of how to use it. We will utilize a combination of information and discussion; questions are encouraged. Optional homework assignments will sometimes be offered.

Plan to attend an informational meeting **after church on September 20**th. Those who are interested in participating will help to set a time and day of the week. The class will meet weekly with Carole Elizabeth teaching the class.
