How To Persevere: Love And Do Good

I am a bit chagrined to admit how many times I have no idea exactly where I am supposed to be going in life. It seems like everybody else is using a Coleman lantern and all I have is a puny flashlight with dying batteries. The path is somewhere out there but I'm struggling to find it.

I imagine this is a bit like how the members of the early Church may have felt. Those early Hebrews, facing persecution for their belief in Jesus' teachings, must have struggled to see the path ahead of them. They must have seriously wondered if they were lost or if they should persevere on their path.

It was to these potentially lost folk that Paul spoke in Hebrews 10: 24-25. He knew they were struggling to persevere as the new church. He knew they needed a guiding light. Luckily, he knew that no one was better suited to guide them than themselves.

24 "And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, **25** not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

According to Paul, the way is simple. There are only three things we need to do to persevere: Help each other to love others; help each other to do good deeds; and come together to encourage and support one another.

I believe Paul's words are still the best guidance we can follow here at Vancouver UCC. We can help one another love others. We can help one another do good deeds. And we can come together to be the church on Sundays as well any of the other six days of the week. We can do all these things because God is still speaking to us and through us. We can do all these things and we will persevere.

Let us light our way towards the future and the good works we can do together!
