From Our Pastor

Do you make New Year's resolutions?

I'm always on the fence about this. On the one hand, I don't want to make resolutions only to set myself up for failure. On the other hand, the New Year DOES seem to be an auspicious time for a fresh start.



A few years ago, I heard the idea of choosing a single guiding word for the year rather than a list of resolutions. Rather than a specific action, I heard, following a guiding word is a way to recalibrate, to return to God's path and your true self. Even better, according to those who instructed me, was to let a word choose YOU, at random.

This seemed like a good idea, so I plucked a word from a pile, and received "kindness." Immediately I wanted to put the word back to see if I get a more exciting one. I wanted an action word! Something bold and brave! Something less, well, milquetoast than simple "kindness." But, I kept with it and in the next twelve months "kindness" surprised me. That year turned out to be a doozy in a number of ways, both personally and professionally. Again and again, I tuned into "kindness" - looking for it in God, in others and in myself. I can't predict much about the year to come, but I do know it will require a constant calibrating and re-tuning to God's call for us as a nation, as a congregation and as individuals. I look forward to be being intentional about listening for that call as we each learn our guiding words for 2017.

As we head into a New Year together, just a note about how and when to reach me.


My hours in Vancouver are Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from 10(ish) to 8(ish). I am also available on Sundays after church.

HEALING THE BELOVED COMMUNITY

Silent Prayer and Meditation in the Public Square SUNDAY, JANUARY 22ND, 2017

In an era of hate speech, hate crimes, and racial profiling, Martin Luther King Jr.'s dream of "the Beloved Community" is more important than ever. The interfaith community of Portland is therefore calling on all people who believe in this dream to gather on **Sunday**, **January 22**, two days after the Presidential inauguration, to stand in solidarity with all those who stand to be marginalized and silenced by the incoming administration.

We will meet a Congregation Beth Israel at 3:30p, hear from Steve Wax of the Oregon Justice Resource Center about resources for those who have experienced a hate crime, followed by a special liturgy and silent march to Pioneer Square. Then, starting at 4:30pm, we will practice silent prayer and meditation for one hour in the name of Peace, Justice, and the Integrity of All Creation. Some parking is available at Congregation Beth Israel and nearby Trinity Church, but as we will be marching down to Pioneer Square afterwards, make your own best decision as to where you'll want your vehicle to be. If you're able, please bring a battery-powered candle that can endure the elements and keep shining out as we pray together.
