Congregational Meeting Announced

Dear Members and Friends,

Following worship on Sunday, October 15, we are pleased to announce a congregational meeting, the purpose of which is to vote to call Rev. Jennifer Garrison Brownell as our pastor and teacher.

You will recall that in October 2015, Pastor Jennifer was hired as an interim for a period of eighteen months. The purpose of the interim time is to allow the congregation the time and space necessary between called pastors to prayerfully discern its next steps in calling a new pastor. Generally, interim pastors are not considered candidates for the called position to follow. With the guidance of then-conference-minister Rev. Walter John Boris, a search committee was formed to find the next called pastor.

Then, in May 2016, a fire destroyed much of the building and disrupted the life of the congregation. Over the next month, it became clear that congregation's energies would have to be directed toward rebuilding and reimagining, rather than searching. Again with the guidance of the Central Pacific Conference, the search committee recommended to the council that the pastoral search be suspended, and that Pastor Jennifer's call agreement be re-negotiated from interim to designated term pastor. Unlike interim pastors, designated term pastors may be considered for the called position to follow if, after prayerful discernment, that arrangement is found to be mutually agreeable for both the pastor and the congregation.

In the two years since our common ministry began, we have found our ministry to be even more than mutually agreeable! Both church and pastor have thrived. We believe that God has already blessed, and will continue to bless, our ministry together. The future ahead looks bright as we anticipate moving back to our church home within a few months.

This vote may seem at first glance like it will not make much of a difference in our everyday life together. Pastor Jennifer will continue her schedule of 8/10 time, and will keep her residence in Oregon. However, by entering into this covenant we are agreeing to follow the lead of the Holy Spirit even more deeply and joyfully, and we believe that this can only have a positive impact on our common life. We look forward to the vote on October 15 as a sign and symbol of our commitment, in the name of Christ, to one another as congregation and pastor.
