SILENT PRAYER IN ACTION


Dear Friends,

Love Your Refugee Neighbor

This December we will continue the UCC 3 Great Loves Campaign by focusing on love for our refugee neighbors. Refugees are proven victims of persecution that flee their homelands in search of hope, justice and a safe place to raise their families. The United States has <u>historically</u> resettled more of the world's refugees than all other countries combined and Vancouver receives between 200-400 refugees per year.

Refugees arrive to the United States with very little and they have to quickly begin their lives over again. Restart Kits are a significant part of us welcoming and honoring them in Vancouver. The kits are filled with essential items that give refugees the start of what they need to rebuild their lives here. The hope is that these kits would bring honor to refugees coming to Vancouver, reflect their dignity, while also meeting a very tangible need. We ask that you only collect new items for these kits, and leave the price tag on the item. (Tags will be removed before the family receives them, but the value of items must be recorded per regu-

Mortgage Match

We are making good progress toward raising \$36,000, to be matched 1:1, to reduce the principal on our mortgage before the loan is refinanced in January. With the November payment we included \$16,100 in gifts and another \$16,100 in matching funds to drop our balance to approximately \$320,000; our goal is \$272,000. If we receive enough gifts to use all of the matching funds we will achieve our goal of having the monthly payment for the refinanced loan at \$1,500 or less.

The current Capital Campaign continues until May 31st, 2018. If you would like to write a check to finish your pledge in December or January it will also help reduce the balance before we refinance.
