Mission & Outreach May Special Offering Triple Point Youth Group

Vancouver Triple Point, a program of Children's Home Society, is Clark County, Washington's safe haven support group and drop-in program for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Intersex, Pansexual, Queer, and Questioning people ages 11 to 18 years old. Triple Point is not only where participants can be proud of their sexual ori-

entation and gender identity, but support others and develop friendships.

Triple Point is a place where participants get to meet supportive peers but also straight and queer supportive adults, agencies, and community to help remove isolation and barriers of discrimination. Participants are able to develop leadership skills and have access to free mental health services if needed.

Upcoming Name Changes

One of the small tasks to accomplish before getting back into the building is making repairs to our street sign. When the Communications ministry began researching the best way to do this, we realized here was another opportunity to reimagine. Priorities are increasing the sign's readability and adding Martha's Pantry and MCC to the sign to highlight our partnership with them.

We wondered how to hold onto our history while reflecting where our congregation and national church are today. Since our beginning, our name has evolved right along-side our ministry. Although we began doing ministry in Vancouver in 1891 as a the **Pilgrim Congregational Church**, we became **First Congregational Church of Vancouver**, **WA** in 1910 and then added "**United Church of Christ**" to our name after we joined the UCC after its creation in 1957. In addition to the changes in our legal name, we have also acquired some nicknames over the years to reduce confusion between us and the other five First Congregational churches in just our conference. Locally, we are typically called Vancouver UCC or First Congregational Vancouver.

We also wondered how to best capture people's attention who find us solely via the internet. Googling "First Congregational" results in many other churches before finding us. However, there is no other Vancouver UCC or Vancouver United Church of Christ.

Communications and the Council agreed that it is prudent for us to file with the Secretary of State any variations of our name and any nicknames we have. For that reason, we have filed to with the State for two "Doing Business As" (DBA): Vancouver United Church of Christ, as well as Vancouver UCC. By adding these DBAs to our official name, we will keep any other organization from using them.

At our congregational meeting on April 29th, Communications announced that our street sign will reflect our DBA instead of our full legal name. Using the DBA of "Vancouver United Church of Christ" will make our street sign more readable as well as allow us to add the complete name of our partner church and their food pantry. This will also save us the expense of demolishing our current sign in order to build a larger sign.

Who we are is not changing. We are still the congregation that has been the voice of progressive Christian ministry in SW Washington since 1891. Our new street sign will simply help people find us so that they can join us in that ministry.
