





- The choir chairs were not salvageable, but the name plaques that were on the chairs were saved. The plaques are mounted on a beautiful board made by

- Jerry Mathis and displayed over the Memorial Table by the elevator.
- The Sanctuary seating (pews) were paid for by memorial gifts from many people. They were not salvageable and have been replaced by the chairs currently in use.
- Many of us purchased hymnals in memory of a loved one. The hymnals were all unfortunately lost.
- Chancel Cross is in good shape.
 Memorial monies in memory of Emil
 and Nettie Fries were used for
 purchase and the plan is to mount
 outside of church building. We have a
 beautiful new cross in the sanctuary
 made by Friends of the Carpenter.
- Many of the hymnal books in the former library were destroyed, but some are still to be found in the new church library in Clawson Corner.
- The bricks for the Honor Garden were purchased with memorial funds. They were saved and will be placed in the church landscaping.
- Memorial funds were also used for the stained glass in the sanctuary roof.
 The stained glass was mostly destroyed in the fire. Several pieces were salvaged by Daryl DeSilva and made into jewelry pendants which were bought by church members and the profits went to the church restructuring. Other pieces were used in the new stained glass cross.
- There were other tangible memorial gifts that were destroyed or lost, but have been replaced so we will not list those items here. We apologize if we have overlooked something. United Church of Christ 3 Great Loves Campaign



This December we will continue the **UCC 3 Great Loves Campaign** by focusing on love for our refugee neighbors. Refugees are proven victims of persecution that flee their homelands in search of hope, justice and a safe place to raise their families. Vancouver has been receiving between 200-400 refugees per year.

Refugees arrive to the United States with very little and they have to quickly begin their lives over again. **Restart Kits** are a significant part of welcoming and honoring them in Vancouver.

The kits are filled with essential items that give refugees the start of what they need to rebuild their lives here. The hope is that these kits would bring honor to refugees coming to Vancouver, reflect their dignity, while also meeting a very tangible need.

We ask that you only collect new items for these kits, and leave the price tag on the item. (Tags will be removed before the family receives them; per regulations the value of items must be recorded.) Sign-up sheets for the Restart Kits will be available at church beginning November 25. Items are due December 16, before worship.

Stewardship Progress Report



Over the last two plus years, we have experienced first hand how much we can accomplish together with the help of the Holy Spirit. Now, God is truly "doing a new thing" among us as we move into 2019. There are so many reasons to give. We give because we have hope in the good things God will continue to do in the community and the world through our congregation. We give because we have trust in God's abundance and so we take a leap of faith as we pledge. We give because we have gratitude for the belonging we experience here. Whatever the reasons you give, thank you. You make this community stronger and more vibrant, so that God's work can continue in and through us, together.

I am pleased to report that as of November 26, **83** pledge cards have been returned, leaving **48** yet to be heard from. Pledges for the 2019 Operating Budget total **\$192,772**, short of our \$228,880 goal by **\$36,108**. The Stewardship Committee appreciates the prompt return of these pledges.






World AIDS Day Commemoration
