The building was not done on a particular day – as you know, the baptismal font we are gathered around was installed just a couple of days ago – a new bowl resting on the stand that has been a part of our church community for generations.

Sometimes we talk about the building like a phoenix rising from the ashes. But when a phoenix rises, it emerges complete and whole from the fire that consumed it. This building, like your marriage, which is not whole and complete today, but is a work in progress that will evolve and grow over time.

That's why its so fitting that you chose this passage from Colossians for your verse today.

Our clothes are not static. Once you get dressed tomorrow, the first day of your married life, you will not look at each other and declare "Well that takes care of that, these are the clothes I will wear every day from now on!" No. Just as we clothe ourselves every day — just as some clothes wear out, and new ones are tried — so will your marriage be an act of resurrection and new life not one time, but every single day. What a blessing to know that you do not have to get it all right today or tomorrow or the next day! What a joy to realize that every day you have the opportunity to again try on compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, patience, love. What a grace that we are — in this building that is a work in progress — reminded that we are also works in progress. May you embrace and enjoy this blessing, joy, and grace every day of your lives together. Amen.

There have been many special moments and I hope we can find the root cause and deal with the problem.



Memorial Funds




UPDATE FROM THE MEMORIALS COMMITTEE

The Memorials Committee has been meeting on a regular basis since being back in the re-imagined church. We have been busy contacting families, working with Property & Finance, and getting input as to the best way to use the memorial funds. So far we have used funds for choir robes, directional and room signs, kitchen flatware, and freezer, All Saint's Day supplies, collection plates, small stained glass cross, music, video system, sound system, and sanctuary doors.

We have used funds donated in memory of Carol Balsigner, Darrell Brandenburg, Lynn Degerstadt, Betty and Jim Ferner, Wilda Fries, Mike Hammer, Anne Kamp, and Marvin Sundheim. We are working on using and disbursing the remaining funds.

When a fund has been depleted or transferred, we make an entry in the Red Book kept in the memorial cabinet by the elevator. There are three books and entries have been made as far back as 1959. The current book is being updated with the latest entries by Nancy Fite, calligrapher, who took over after Joan Blair passed away. We urge everyone to look at these books and the plaques above the stand. Because of the generous donations to the Memorial Fund, much has been done to make our church beautiful and enhance the worship services. These funds cover the cost of items that are outside and beyond the normal church budget. We welcome input and questions from you regarding the work of our committee. CONGREGATION NEWS



A church emergency plan is a document that answers all the questions of what, where, when, how, and who, in the case of a sudden calamity. The more specific the plan is, the less precious time will be lost in the event of a disaster.

In December 2018, Church Council authorized a sub-committee to develop a safety plan for our church. On any given Sunday there are eyes observing the surroundings inside and outside of the building to be sure that everyone is safe. There is an on-going work-in-progress ensuring that the congregation is a safe as they can possibly be. You will notice some changes in the coming months.

First, one of the more obvious visuals you will see is an evacuation plan that will be posted throughout the building that will assist everyone to evacuate the building in the case of an emergency, to fire, tornado, earthquake, power outage or other emergencies that would require evacuation. Please take time to study it.


We are identifying items that need to be acquired that are not in the current budget, including two AED's (Automated External Defibulator), each one is approximately \$1625. A fund has been started to acquire them. We are also looking into purchasing three medical bags placed strategically around the building and at least two first aid kits, among other items. If anyone wishes to contribute, you may send a check in care of First Congregational Church and write on the memorandum line, "for AED purchase" or "medical supplies". Any contribution is appreciated.

A written emergency plan will be available, but prior to that plan being completed there are things that will need to happen. It has been determined that the Federal Emergency Management Association (FEMA) has a grant that will assist houses of worship in the US to purchase safety equipment for natural disasters. Grant writing is time-consuming, but if successful can be a major benefit and can offset costs some of the items mentioned above.

There will be updates periodically as various portions of the plan are completed.

The race will start at Esther Short Park in downtown Vancouver, and the course will be a quick, flat out-and-back along the shore of the Columbia River. AIDS is very much a global issue but also local to Clark County. Proceeds collected for Lyle's Myles will be split between three non-profit organizations working for a World without HIV/ADS. 30% of proceeds go to Global Partners for Development, funding projects in Africa to break the cycle of poverty and save lives. 60% goes to Martha's Pantry in Vancouver, providing food, toiletries, clothing and more to the poorest and most needy individuals and families living with HIV/AIDS.
