float, and to Randy for towing and driving!



I am so thankful for John Fite's humor and leadership! On June 23, he facilitated a robust conversation about the proposed changes to the alcohol policy here at Vancouver UCC. Thirty people were able to attend that meeting and many more have either sent emails or notes, or spoken directly with me, in order to share their thoughts on the topic.

At the Council meeting on June 25, the proposed policy change was returned to the Property & Finance work group as written. In order that all members are able to have input on the proposed changes to the alcohol policy, we will have a short congregational meeting following the service on July 14. At that meeting, we will vote on making the proposed change and we will use a paper ballot with the options of "Yes", "No", or "I Can Live With It". All members have received the proposed policy language, but if you need an additional copy, please request one from the office.

Thank you to everyone for sharing your ideas and opinions on how we may live into our re-imagined space and place in our community. We may not always agree, but by sharing and caring about one another, we are sure to grow together as well.

Council is also excited to be gathering for a retreat on July 27 in lieu of the traditional monthly meeting. We will be practicing *Art of Hosting* leadership techniques as a way to engage with our work groups.

May the blessings of this community echo throughout our gathered experience, and may the peace and love of Jesus be in all our hearts.

Please take a look at this map and sign up for an area that you would like to manage for the summer. Thank you to those that have already signed up!


