



Dear Ones.

More than twenty centuries ago, a writer named Tertullian described his Christian community and what made them distinct from the people around them. The group's money, he wrote, was collected and used "to support and bury poor people, to supply the wants of boys and girls destitute of means and parents, and of old persons confined now to the house; such, too, as have suffered shipwreck; and if there happen to be any in the mines or banished to the islands or shut up in the prisons...But it is mainly the deeds of a love so noble that lead many to put a brand upon us. See, they say, how they love one another (for they themselves

are animated by mutual hatred). See, they say about us, how they are ready even to die for one another (for they themselves would sooner kill)."

From the very earliest days of Christianity, care for one another and for those who suffer the most in our communities has been, as Tertullian said, our "brand." No matter how the communities around us behave toward one another, as Christians we have been called to be different - and that difference is shown by our love for each other and how that love is enacted in directly caring for one another.

If you sign up now, you can get your preferred "job" as a host, or a food or supply provider. Remember, mature youth 10 and above can sign up to help – 1 youth per adult.

New this year: Instead of 1 volunteer week, we are scheduled for 2 half-weeks. The dates are: Feb. 20 to the morning of Feb. 23⁷ and March 4 to the morning of March 8. If you are a seasoned "veteran" please invite a new person to serve with you and share in this meaningful experience. Volunteering is easier than ever this year by using SignUp.

UPDATE FROM THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY



Several members have approached me asking why our pledge income is lower this year.

On the plus side we had seven new pledges totaling \$10,260, and 37 pledges were increased by \$17,680.

We lost \$2,380 from pledges that went down, and lost \$37,482 from people who pledged in 2019, but did not pledge in 2020. That left us with a deficit of \$19,662.
