

Naselle Gift Provides Ukrainian Refugee Relief

The Naselle Workgroup met on Sunday, March 20, and decided to recommend to Council a donation of \$10,000 to the UCC Ukrainian Emergency Appeal. The United Church of Christ is working directly with the Hungarian Reformed Church Aid to provide food and shelter to Ukrainian refugees entering Hungary. As of March 15, the UCC Appeal has raised \$378,000 for Ukrainian refugees. If you would like to make your own contribution to this appeal you may do so at Ukraine Emergency Appeal - United Church of Christ (ucc.org)

The Naselle Workgroup also voted at their recent meeting to recommend to Council that the remaining funds from the Naselle gift (approximately \$9100) be moved into a special Naselle Humanitarian Assistance Fund managed by the Mission and Outreach Ministry to be used for local, national, and international humanitarian relief.

It is the hope of the Naselle Workgroup that this fund will be self-sustaining through ongoing gifts from our congregation, so we are always able to help people in need. You may do so by writing Naselle Humanitarian Assistance on the memo line of your check or by going to the Vanco website to make your donation.


The Council approved both recommendations at their March 22 meeting, thus when the funds have been disbursed and transferred the Naselle Workgroup will disband. Many thanks to Darryl DeSilva, Brian Fick, Chuck Foulke, Brenda Gaston, Bert Martin, Jerry Mathis, Eric Pykonen, Dan Schnabel, and Jeanie Stolle, and for their participation in the Naselle

Workgroup. And our abundant thanks to the former Naselle church for providing the \$40,000 gift to our church in 2018.

Approximately half of this gift was allocated for humanitarian assistance and the other half funded the residing of the Centennial Wing last year.

Clark County Purchases Church Land for 68th Street Project



With the widening of 68th Street between Hwy 99 and St. Johns Road, the county needed to purchase a small strip of the church's land. 68th Street is being widened to construct a sidewalk on the south side of the street and a bike lane on the north side of the street. The county made an offer of \$9700 for the land, the necessary landscape change on our property, and the relocation of our church sign. Property and Finance researched the cost to move our sign and the associated cost to move the electrical service at the sign and made a counter-proposal of \$13,250. The County recently accepted the P&F proposal, and the Council approved this purchase at their March 22 meeting.
