

CARE FOR OUR EARTH #2 SE THE POLLUTION SOLUTION

The <u>Great Pacific Garbage Patch</u> still exists. It is a floating "island" of debris, mostly plastic, in the North Pacific Ocean. It spans 1.6 million square kilometers or over 600,000 square miles from California to Japan with Hawaii in the middle. Plastic pollution in the ocean threatens marine life in several ways – poisoning and starving fish, bleaching coral, and harming reefs.

The "Ocean Cleanup" is an organization using high-tech tools to remove trillions of pieces of plastic pollution which is mostly plastic. They use two ships to tow a U-shaped catchment system across the ocean's surface. It brings the garbage to a larger boat to be carried ashore. They say they recycle a majority of the plastic they collect to be made into new products. Knowing that so much plastic, even in good shape is not the grade that can be recycled, puts that claim in question. The remaining debris is incinerated to generate electricity (thermal recycling) but that process releases toxins and pollutants into our air, soil, and water, ultimately threatening human health.

So, it seems that even our best attempts are imperfect solutions. At this point, we only have ONE REAL SOLUTION to changing this situation and that is to prevent plastic from

getting into the ocean in the first place, or, STOP USING SO MUCH PLASTIC.

YOUR ASSIGNMENT, IF YOU ACCEPT IT:

Survey what is in your kitchen as you use it in the next several weeks. If it is plastic, is that plastic safe to continue using (no scratches or gouges that release chemicals from the plastic)? If it is safe to use, continue to use it. If there are things that need to be replaced check in a bit later. Don't forget to look at food and the containers that it arrives in. I will bring in examples of good kitchen alternatives for those things that need replacing over time. You will see notice of it in the <u>Dove</u> shortly after I get back in town and can get ready.

For here they dwell




Hearing Assistance Available for our Sanctuary
