YES SPRING IS COMING!

As you may know, I took a cruise to the Caribbean to catch some sun when none was available here in Washington. In preparation, I asked my daughter to help me find a SUNSCREEN that would be safe and not harm anything in the ocean, especially coral. I wanted SPF 45. She reminded me that the container was just as important (no more plastic bottles left behind). This was not an easy assignment!

What are the problems with sunscreen? Most sunscreens on our store shelves have harmful chemicals in them. They are: Oxybenzone, Octinoxate, Octocrylene, 3-benzylidene camphor, 4-

methylbenzylidene camphor,
Benzophenone-1, Benzophenone-8, OD
-PABA, nano zinc oxide or nano titanium
dioxide. No, you do not have to
memorize this impressive list! It is
estimated that up to 14,000 TONS of
these chemicals get washed into coral
reefs per year.



Sunscreen chemicals are known to harm GREEN ALGAE, CORAL, MUSSELS, SEA URCHINS, FISH, AND DOLPHINS in different ways. Not only are they found in the water after just using a small amount one time, but they are also found in human blood. How does it get in our water? It washes off if we go in the water to play or swim but also when we shower after using it. The worst way it gets there is through SPRAY ON SUNSCREEN. It gets in the sand or ground and goes from there. PLEASE DO NOT USE SUNSCREEN SPRAY as too much goes places other than your skin.

A few other things to know before we

get to what you can do. Sunscreen that says it is "Reef Safe" is not necessarily so as the government has not determined exactly what that term is to mean so any product can use the label. If you apply sunscreen 30 minutes before going in the water you can help prevent it from washing off. You will also need to consider packaging as more plastic bottles do not help us either. Well-intentioned regulations don't always work. Hawaii has banned the use of two chemicals on the list but has not figured out who is to monitor this and what penalties will apply. You will be generally safe choosing kids' sunscreen as they do not usually use the bad chemicals.



Consider these ideas to prevent sunburn: limit your time exposed to the sun, seek shade from 10 am to 2 pm, wear a sun hat, use UV glasses, and wear a UPF sun shirt or pants.

I looked at pictures from our cruise and I sure didn't look stylish but I also did not get sunburned!

I took three choices of sunscreen with me. I chose two sunscreens specifically for kids as they usually don't put all those chemicals in them. One was in a stick and I found it not useful to cover a lot of area. It was Simple Truth Kids Mineral Based sunscreen. It did a good job but is best for small places only. I tried an Alba Botanica kids sunscreen in a soft plastic squeeze bottle. I like it the best as it worked and went on more easily. The problem? You need a magnifying glass and good light to read all the ingredients which I did not do before buying. The third one I tried was All Good Mineral Sport Sunscreen but I don't exactly know what is in it, and it was the same consistency as the stick

and did not spread well. The positive is that they package it in <u>tins</u>, so NO plastic.

When you go shopping look for mineral-based, zinc, and titanium-based. Most of the common and advertised brands are not good choices. Here is a list of some good ones: All Good Mineral Sport Sunscreen, Love Sun Body Mineral Sunscreen, Supergoop Mineral Sheer Screen, Hawaiian Tropic Mineral Sunscreen, Unsun Mineral Tinted Face Sunscreen, Goddess Garden Mineral Sport Sunscreen, Babo Botanicals Clear Zinc Sunscreen, Bare Republic Mineral sunscreen for face, Badger Mineral Sunscreen.
