
TREASURER'S REPORT—STEVE BLOODWORTH

The outside of the sanctuary has been painted, new curbs have been installed and plans are underway to repair and restripe the parking lot. All of these activities have been paid for by the surplus from prior years. Our normal monthly expenses remain stable, and we were able to add just under \$8,000 to our surplus during the month of June, thanks to your continued faithful giving.

If anyone would like to be our next Treasurer, please let me know. Besides "paying the bills," the Treasurer also manages the payroll function which includes filing quarterly reports with the state and the IRS. A basic knowledge of accounting would be helpful, along with basic computer skills. The numerical portion of my report below is done in Excel, so basic Excel knowledge would also be helpful. 2023 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS



Your Property and Finance team has been busy this summer with two capital improvement projects. The first is the painting of the south and east sides of the sanctuary building, utilizing the two paint colors that were used on the Centennial Wing when that siding was replaced in 2021. After scraping and before painting, the areas that were peeling received an adhesive coating that will help the new paint adhere to the building. We are hopeful this will prevent the blistering and peeling we experienced after the last painting in 2018.

The second project pertains to the parking lot and is happening in two phases. Phase one is the replacement of deteriorated curbing. This happened on July 18 & 19 and almost all the curbing was replaced. We did not do the curb on the street side of the front berm because we think that the curb will be removed when the sidewalk and street improvements happen on 68th Street over the next year. The second phase is the repair of deteriorated and missing sections of the blacktop. This work will be followed by sweeping and sealing of the entire lot, and then restriping parking spots and labeling handicapped parking spots.

These major capital projects are funded from reserves from prior budget years; thus, they do not have an impact on our annual operating budget.
