
As we look to the remainder of the year and beyond, it's a reminder that there are still good

We have the church picnic on July 16 and the efforts of the search committee will shift to a smaller group who will be tasked with preparing for candidates who apply for our settled pastor position. The members of council will continue doing the work that needs to be done but the realization that several are coming to the end of their terms is starting to weigh heavy. This is where others are needed to pick up where they leave off. We will have open positions for the Moderator, Financial Secretary, Treasurer, and some other committee chairs who also serve as key council positions. The church by-laws mandate that these roles are filled by one member for a set term so that the church can benefit from new people coming in, who can offer different perspectives, and individual skill sets. It is crucial for the church to have these roles filled to function. The same people can't be expected to keep doing the same thing. For our church to grow, it has to start from within.

Over the next few months, there will be articles coming out about the different roles that make up the church council. This month, I will say a little bit about being the moderator. The moderator serves as the head of the executive team and church council. Their primary function is to provide general leadership for the church functions and host meetings. They facilitate the annual congregational meeting, monthly executive team and council meetings and any other special meetings needed throughout the year. They may serve as a guide for any issues the individual committees are working through. They are the tie-breaking vote in council meetings, if needed. The moderator is a position where an individual can take as far as they feel compelled to. They can immerse themselves in all the wonderful things happening at the church or hang back and just let people do their thing, and only jump in when asked to do so.

Our church has long been a part of the Washington Faith Action Network (FAN). FAN partners for the common good by advocacy through state legislative action and other ways. Our church attended the Spring Summit held in SW Washington on June 4 (hybrid Zoom/inperson). FAN will have a booth at Vancouver's Peace and Justice Fair on September 9.

A few wins in the 2023 state legislature were requiring a permit to purchase firearms, prohibiting shut off of customer utilities during extreme heat, and increasing the rental assistance program. Reauthorization of the federal Farm Bill is coming up. You are encouraged to contact your senators and congressional representative to prioritize food assistance funding in the Farm Bill.
