

Perhaps this position can best be explained by listing some of the things Property & Finance has been involved with over the past five and a half years that I have been the P&F Council representative. So here we go:


- Preparation of the annual church budget
- Ongoing monitoring of church income and expenses
- Painting the exterior of the sanctuary and centennial wing
- Remediation of stormwater drain lines and the connected dry wells
- Bi-annual outdoor cleanup days in spring and fall

- Sealing and striping of the parking lot
- Negotiations with the County regarding their purchase of some of our land along 68th Street
- Relocation of the church sign at 68th Street because of the sidewalk project on 68th Street
- Negotiate with the developer of the land to the east of the labyrinth to preserve as many trees and as much vegetation as possible
- Selection of a new insurance carrier for the church
- Research and selection of a new security company for the church
- Re-siding of the centennial wing
- Selection of new church software that allows remote access to church databases
- Investigation of options for maintenance of our 31-year-old elevator
- Research our various church names and find a pathway to one unified name


The Christmas Fund for the Veterans of the Cross and the Emergency Fund
