



Sometime this fall, there will be an emergency drill. Please read the Evacuation Maps that are posted in the Sanctuary, Nettie Fries Lounge, by the Elevator (both lower level and main levels.)

- As a reminder, anyone seated (facing the altar) on the left side of the main aisle will exit through the Emergency Doors near the rear of the Sanctuary.
- Those seated (facing the altar) on the right side of the main aisle will exit through the Main Entrance doors.
- The choir will exit through the Main Entrance doors.
- Those who are seated at the tables in the back will exit through the Emergency Exit.
- Once outside, everyone will meet at the Antoinette Agerter Garden in the Southwest corner of the church property.
- The youth and nursery will be guided by Safety Committee members to the Antoinette Agerter Garden.
- There will also be non-committee members to aide members of the congregation that might need assistance.
- If a member is seated next to or near a visitor, please assist them by directing to the appropriate exit. We do this drill to educate everyone about the safety measures that have been in place since the fire in 2016.
- Copies of the Emergency Procedures Manual are throughout the building, as are first aid kits, fire extinguishers, and AED devices.



Pollution Solution

PLASTIC IS EVERYWHERE - In a new study of brains, scientists found that the amount of plastic they contained was 50% higher than that in the same study in 2016. It now means that our brains today are 99.5% brain, and the rest is plastic. This study does not inform us about actual brain damage.


Brains contained 7 to 30 times more tiny shards of plastic than samples from the cadaver's kidneys and liver. These researchers suspect that the brain pulls in the very smallest nano plastics passing the blood-brain barrier, with larger sizes going to other organs. Polyethylene, which is used in plastic bags, films, and bottles, is not biodegradable and is the predominant type of plastic found in tissue samples.

What scientists do know with certainty is that these microplastic particles are like Trojan horses – they carry with them all the thousands of chemicals that are in plastics, and some are very bad actors.

The message here is that we cannot escape plastic, but we can minimize our exposure. Single-use plastic and food and water in plastic are some of the ways you can avoid some of the plastic in our world. Take food out of the plastic wrapping before you cook it or put it in the microwave. Remember that heat accelerates the movement of the microplastics out of the wrapping into the food. Bring your own cup/mug and silverware to your place of work to avoid using plastic cups and utensils. <u>Take the time to assess plastic in your own home and environment!!</u>

You will see soon that, as a church, we will be moving to decrease our use of single-use and other plastics as much as possible. STAY TUNED! ~ Pat Sutherland

HERE'S AN OPPORTUNITY FOR REDUCING YOUR CARBON FOOTPRINT

Instant \$9000 State EV rebates for low-to-middle income residents, by Don Steinke

On August 1, 2024, the State of Washington launched its *Instant EV Rebate Program* for low-to-mid income residents. Residents may also qualify for additional instant Federal rebates of up to \$7500.

The State requirement depends on:

- household income
- lease vs purchase
- new vs used

The Federal requirement depends on:

- household income (less restrictive than the State requirement.)
- your tax liability
- lease vs purchase
- domestic content (but not if leased)
- new vs used

Caution 1: If you cannot plug in where you sleep, your first question should be: Where can you charge conveniently and affordably? Quick charging, such as at Walmart or Vancouver Plaza, usually costs 4 times as much as it would cost if you slow-charge where you sleep or work. Heavy duty infrastructure is expensive.
